## What is EU-CiP?

**EU-CiP is a European online portal** that will help people affected by cancer find reliable and trustworthy information.

It collects evidence-based cancer information from trusted European and national sources, presented in a clear and patient-friendly way.

The portal is designed and built together with patients, survivors and healthcare experts to support people at different stages of the cancer journey.

## Why it matters for cancer patients and survivors

When you are diagnosed with cancer – or living with the consequences of it – finding **clear, trustworthy information** can be difficult and overwhelming.

EU-CiP matters because it helps patients and survivors make informed decisions, understand their options and feel more secure throughout their care and life after cancer.

It also supports people who often feel overlooked, such as those living with late effects from treatment, recurrence or long-term impact of cancer.

### Reliable information when you need it:

EU-CiP gives you evidence-based cancer information you can trust - from prevention to diagnosis, treatment, rehabilitation and life after treatment.

- Links to relevant national resources in your country

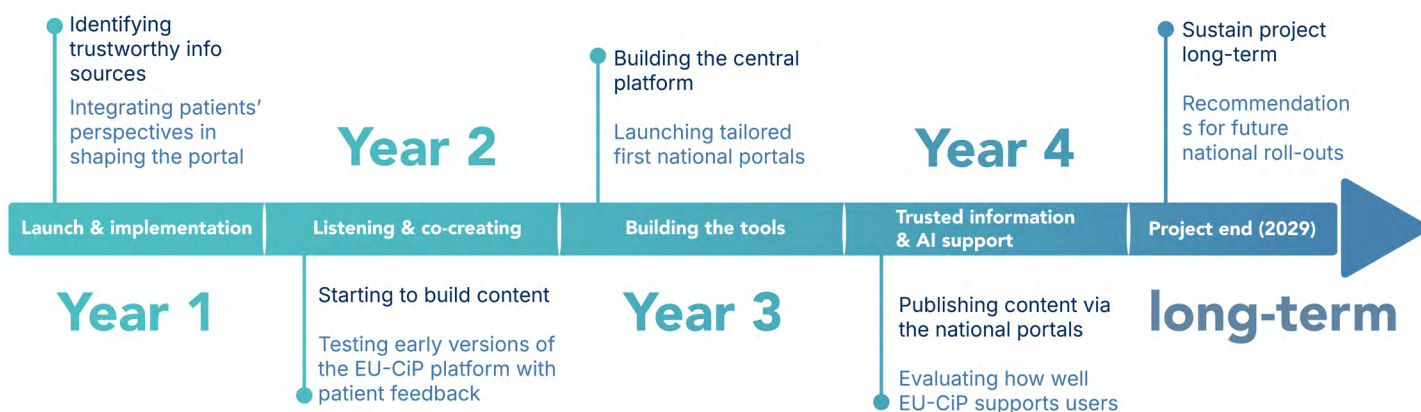
## Project timeline

Over its course (May 2025 - Apr 2029) the project first builds a central platform that contains a Library of Content and all functionalities of the portal (incl. an AI-assisted chatbot helping users quickly find the information they need.

Based on this central platform the portal is first implemented in the roll-out pilot country Lithuania.

This pilot phase will extend to providing tailored portals for Austria, Germany, Spain, Hungary, Luxembourg, Malta, Norway, Romania, Sweden and Slovenia.

At all stages, patient organisations are involved in designing and refining the portal to ensure that the final version meets the needs of users.

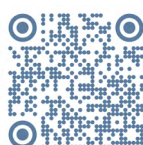

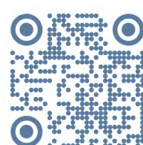
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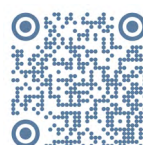
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
